Approval of Minutes

Mr. Rachlin made a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting and Closed Session held on February 19, 2026. The motion was seconded by Mr. Tomaine and approved by those present.

Report of Treasurer

Ms. Musialowicz stated that a report for December 2025 was forwarded to the Commissioners.

Report of Executive Director

Sewer Connection Applications

Mr. Buonocore reported that a total of six sewer connection applications were processed in the month of February. A copy of the monthly report was distributed to the commissioners.

Plant O&M Update

Mr. Buonocore reported that the Authority experienced an upset in the final settling tanks last month which caused high effluent TSS levels for several days. This resulted in effluent violations for several 7-day average TSS limits as well as the monthly average limit for February. We are in constant contact with our DEP enforcement officer and our levels are back in compliance.

Recently, the pH of the sludge in our Digesters has dropped dramatically from the 7 range to around 5. We've started adding lime into the digesters to bring the pH back up into the normal operating range, but until that happens we have stopped adding food waste. We are monitoring the system closely as we recover and are also reviewing the data with our consultants to help identify the cause of the drop.

The food waste storage tank is back in operation and but have now shut down again due to the digester concerns.

Mr. Buonocore provided an update on the status of the dryer which is currently being restarted.

Collection System O&M Update

Mr. Buonocore reported that we are reviewing the bid documents for the upcoming CIPP project, which will hopefully go out to bid this spring.

Also, we are coordinating with our inspection contractor to begin TVing lines now that the weather is better.

Our GIS program is ongoing and we have made good progress with NJ Future and CDM.

Amendment to Contract #2425 – ACTIVATED SLUDGE & CHEMICAL TREATMENTS

Mr. Buonocore reported that George Cheskowich our Operational Manager has advised that there is a need to amend Contract #2425 with Aquafix Inc. for additional monies. The requested change order is in the amount of \$20,800.00 due to additional required chemical treatments, for a total amended contract amount of \$125,248.00. Action to approve is on the agenda.

Amendment to Access Agreement with Pride Solvents & Chemical Company of NJ

As part of an ongoing environmental investigation, we have previously entered into an access agreement with Pride Solvents & Chemical Company to install monitoring wells on our property. Pride has now been directed to install 2 additional wells on the RVSA property which requires an amendment to their access agreement. A resolution for this amendment has been added to the agenda under New Business.

Mr. Buonocore reported that we have two upcoming tours: one with a group from the Rutgers Environmental Stewardship program on the evening of April 21, 2026, and another with the NJ League of Conservation Voters on April 22, 2026.

Additionally, he provided an update on the paving project contract. He walked the site with Mr. Matteson, the engineer, and mentioned that the paving bid should be ready to go out in the next couple of weeks.

Monthly Reports

The Monthly Operations, IPP, Flow Rights, and User Charge Reports were forwarded to the Commissioners for review.

Report of Consulting Engineer

Howard Matteson, Consulting Engineer from the firm CDM Smith, submitted the following report for work activities for the month of February 2026 and through the date of this report.

A. Retainer Services

During the period, CDM Smith prepared the monthly report for February 2026 and attended February 2026 Board Meeting.

B. Miscellaneous Engineering Services

During the period, CDM Smith assisted RVSA with the following:

RNG Facility Electrical – continued coordinating with staff on approach for the electrical feed for the new RNG facility. Provided load summary to staff and with updated one-line diagram, and technical memorandum for staff review.

- Paving – advanced drawing and technical specifications related to various paving repairs located throughout the facility. Drafts have been provided to staff.

- Digester #3 Cleaning – Submitted draft plans and technical specification to staff for review. Based on review with staff, we will be adding the replacement of the membrane to the project scope as an add-alternate bid item.
- GIS Assistance – coordinated with staff from SU / NJF related to ongoing work related to this grant project and organized ArcGIS Online portal. Began development of a template Intermunicipal Agreement in GIS for staff review.
- USACE Floodwall – met with staff and representatives of USACE to discuss levee/floodwall improvements onsite.

C. Influent Bar Screen Replacement

During the period, CDM Smith assisted RVSA with the following:

- Worked with Contractor to resolve all remaining contingency work items, and met with contractor to negotiate same. Began development of closeout change order which will result in an overall credit to the project.
- Assisted RVSA in processing current pay request. Final pay request is anticipated next month.

D. Electrical Maintenance and Testing Assistance

Testing is now complete.

The remaining report from Longo on their relay testing recently performed at the 13.2 kV Utility Intertie - Control Generator SWGR is still outstanding. We are coordinating with Longo to obtain it. Once received, we can issue the Draft Report to staff for their review.

Report of General Counsel

Diane Alexander, General Counsel from the firm Maraziti Falcon, submitted the following report for the period through March 9, 2026.

1. Proposed Judicial Consent Order Approving Settlement with 3M Company and DuPont

As discussed, RVSA received notices of proposed settlements with 3M Company and DuPont in the matter of NJDEP, et al., v. E.I. Du Pont De Nemours and Company, et al. As discussed at past meetings, the proposed settlement eliminates any recourse related to PFAS liability incurred by public entities (including the RVSA). On

January 7, 2026, a hearing was held at the US District Courthouse in Camden, Chief Judge Renée Bumb, presiding. The State of NJ, Department of

Environmental Protection (NJDEP) and the defendants, 3M and DuPont, sought the Judge’s approval of the two proposed Judicial Consent Orders (JCOs). The Judge did not give her consent at that time, but instead ordered the NJDEP to prepare and submit evidence documenting how it assessed the costs of PFAS remediation statewide when NJDEP conducted the settlement talks with 3M and DuPont that led to the \$2.3 billion settlement amount.

A virtual Settlement Meeting was held on February 17, 2026. An in-person Settlement Meeting, including the Magistrate Judge, our office and the State/NJDEP, is scheduled for tomorrow, March 10 at 3 World Trade Center, NYC at the offices of counsel for the NJDEP (Kelley Drye & Warren) to determine if the differences in position can be reconciled. Thereafter, our response to the State’s draft supplement to its motion to approve the 3M and DuPont JCOs is due March 16, 2026. Submission of the State’s final version supplementing its motion to approve the 3M and DuPont JCOs is due April 2, 2026. The deadline for the response of Amici to the State’s supplement is due May 4, 2026 and an in-person court hearing on the State’s motion to approve the settlements is scheduled for June 24, 2026.

2. Miscellaneous issues

We are currently working with the RVSA Executive Director, as needed, with regard to a Shared Services Agreement with Rahway for RVSA’s use of salt from Rahway’s salt storage facility located adjacent to RVSA property and procurement of a prefabricated building under the Sourcewell Co-op contract.

WHEREAS, the Rahway Valley Sewerage Authority (“Authority”) had previously entered into a contract for Activated Sludge Microbiology Advisement & Chemical Treatment with Aquafix, Inc; and

WHEREAS, Contract #2425 was awarded to Aquafix, Inc for said services, in an amount of \$104,448.00; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined there is a need to amend Contract #2425 for an additional amount of \$20,800.00; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary-Treasurer of the Authority, who is the Chief Financial Officer, hereby certifies that the necessary funds for said amendment are available in the Annual Budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Rahway Valley Sewerage Authority that the previously awarded contract with Aquafix Inc, in an amount of \$104,448.00 be and is hereby amended for an additional amount of \$20,800.00, for a total amended contract amount of \$125,248.00; and

RESOLUTION #26-10

WHEREAS, the Rahway Valley Sewerage Authority (“RVSA” or “Authority”) previously entered into a Property Access Agreement (“Agreement”) with Pride Solvents & Chemical Company of NJ, Inc., (“Pride”) on February 8, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Agreement is to allow environmental consultants to perform an investigation on a portion of the RVSA facility property in proximity to the Pride Property, in order to determine whether there has been any environmental contamination of the RVSA property emanating from the Pride Property; and

WHEREAS, by Amendment to the Property Access Agreement, dated August 31, 2021, the parties amended the term of the Agreement from February 8, 2019 to February 8, 2023; and

WHEREAS, by Amendment to the Property Access Agreement, dated July 24, 2023, the parties amended the term of the Agreement to from February 8, 2023 to February 8, 2027; and

WHEREAS, Pride has now been directed to install two (2) additional monitoring wells upon the RVSA Property at the locations set forth on the Proposed Monitoring Well Location Map, dated November 3, 2025, prepared by WSP USA Environment & Infrastructure Inc., (“Proposed Monitoring Well Location Map”) attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, RVSA has determined that it is in the best interest of the Authority to allow Pride and its consultants continued access to the RVSA Property for the purposes of conducting its environmental investigation and is willing to extend such access with respect to the two (2) additional wells identified on the attached Proposed Monitoring Well Location Map, provided that Pride continues to comply with the terms and conditions set out in the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Commissioners of the Rahway Valley Sewerage Authority that the Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to execute an amendment to the Agreement to allow Pride and its consultants continued access to the RVSA Property for the purposes of conducting its investigation including the installation and monitoring of two (2) additional wells as identified on the attached Proposed Monitoring Well Location Map, in a form substantially in conformance with the “Third Amendment to Property Access Agreement Between Pride Solvents & Chemical Company of NJ, Inc. and the Rahway Valley Sewerage Authority” attached; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the RVSA Executive Director, staff and consultants are authorized and directed to take all actions reasonable and necessary in the implementation of this Resolution and this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
