



Construction of upgrades and improvements to Rahway Valley Sewerage Authority, Headworks Influent Bar Screen Replacement, \$4,800,000 were financed by the New Jersey Water Bank (NJWB). The NJWB is a State Revolving Fund program jointly administered by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (NJIB) and uses a combination of funds provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, the DEP, and the NJIB to provide very low interest loans to borrowers for environmental infrastructure projects.

This project will provide water quality benefits including more efficient and effective screening and washer compactors for residents and businesses in the Boroughs of Garwood, Kenilworth, Mountainside, and Roselle Park, the City of Rahway, The Town of Westfield, and The Townships of Clark, Cranford, Scotch Plains, Springfield, all in Union County, and the Township of Woodbridge in Middlesex County.

State Revolving Fund programs around the nation provide states and communities the resources necessary to maintain and improve the infrastructure protecting our valuable water resources nationwide.
